It is not intended as a guide as to what medication should be used for the treatment of any particular child or constellation of problems and does not constitute medical advice. The order of medications within each cell is random and does not imply their frequency as the prescribed medication or their efficacy. Many of these medications have not been researched on children or adolescents and/or are not approved by the FDA – in many cases, doctors are prescribing these medications “off-label.”
